

The total Pupil Premium funding for Dartford Primary Academy during the financial year 2016/17 was £194,800.

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## How did we use the money 2016-2017?

During the academic year 2016-17, we spent the Pupil Premium funding for Dartford Primary Academy in the following ways:

- Employing a full time qualified teacher specifically to support to those children, across KS2, entitled to Pupil Premium who have not made significant progress or who are working at below age expected levels in an aim to close the gap between PP students and Non PP students.
- 2 HLTA's employed to deliver interventions at both the Juniors and the Infants sites for Literacy, Numeracy and SALT.
- Employing a full time Pupil Support worker to support children who find school life more challenging.
- Running a pilot for the Sollihiull parenting approach.
- Breakfast club on both sites
- Access to the school minibus to support with attendance and for families that have a long distance to travel to school.
- Support with purchasing uniform.
- The first group of children invited to attend extracurricular clubs and half term holiday schools.
- The first group of children to be able to access a peer mentor.
- Specific attendance support from dedicated attendance officer.
- The first group of children to receive ELSA as an intervention where needed.
- Employing a specialist maths teacher one day per week to enhance the provision for the most able children in KS2.
- Access to 1:1 tutors for Maths for PixL year 5 and 6 students.
- HLTA Run a parent group to support parents in turn supporting their children with early literacy facts.
- Enabling Year 5 pupils to take part in the Choral Outreach Project.
- Subsidising school trips and extra-curricular activities.
- Employed a member of staff at KS1 for Breakfast club tuition for identified PP children that would benefit from extra Literacy input.
- Employed a male tutor for 1:1 tuition one afternoon a week with a focus on writing for identified PP children who were under achieving boys.
- Access to Homework and lunch time clubs
- Targeted SALT support via the Talkboost program.

## Achievement of Children Eligible for Pupil Premium

Table 1 below shows how children entitled to Pupil premium achieved at the end of KS1 :
